Class 66 - Toffee Apple Traybake

175 g butter or margarine	175g light soft brown sugar
3 medium eggs	250g SR flour
2 teaspoon ground cinnamon	100g chopped dates
2 eating apples	
Icing:	25g butter
	5 tablespoons light brown sugar
	2 tablespoons cream

Greased traybake tin about 20 cm/ 8 inch square

1. Oven 175°C, Fan oven 160°C, Gas 4
2. Cream butter/margarine with sugar until light
3. Add the beaten egg gradually
4. Sieve flour with cinnamon and fold into the mixture
5. Peel, core and chop apple
6. Gently add dates and apple to mixture
7. Put into tin and bake on middle shelf for 35-40 minutes.
8. Leave in tin for 15 minutes before putting on cooling rack
9. Make icing by placing all ingredients in saucepan and melt slowly until sugar has dissolved. Bring to the boil and simmer for 3 minutes. Remove from heat and allow to cool, beat well and drizzle over the cake.
10. When set cut into slices.
