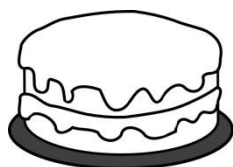

Recipe for class 56 (thanks go to Cherry Jones)

French Yogurt Cake

125 gram yogurt (LLaeth y Llan yogurt is sold in this size can be plain or flavoured)

1 yogurt container of vegetable oil e.g. sunflower

2 yogurt containers of Caster sugar

3 yogurt containers of Self Raising flour

3 eggs

1tsp vanilla essence for plain yogurt cake

OR

50 gram fruit to match yogurt (e.g. raspberry yogurt and raspberries)

- 1) Grease and base line 9 inch/ 23cm spring form tin
- 2) Oven 180 C, Gas 4
- 3) Pour the yogurt into a large mixing bowl
- 4) Add eggs and oil plus vanilla (if using)
- 5) Wash yogurt container and dry well. Measure and add sugar
- 6) Whisk until ingredients combined
- 7) Measure flour and sieve into mixture. Mix in without over working
- 8) If adding fruit stir in gently
- 9) Pour into prepared tin and bake for 35- 40 minutes until firm on top and skewer comes out clean
- 10) Allow to cool (can be stored in airtight container for up to 5 days)
