**Recipe for class 56 (thanks go to Cherry Jones)**

### **Crispy Cheese Biscuits**

120 gm salted block butter  
 100 gm finely grated mature cheddar cheese  
 150 gm plain flour  
 35 gm Rice Krispies  
 1/2 level tsp baking powder  
 1/2 level tsp mustard powder  
 Pinch cayenne pepper

1. Oven 150 C / 130 C Fan / Gas 2
2. Cream butter and grated cheese together
3. Sieve flour, baking powder, mustard and cayenne pepper
4. Add to cheese mixture and mix well together
5. Add Rice Krispies be careful not to crush them too much
6. Divide into equal walnut sized pieces and place on baking tray ( it doesn't need to be greased)
- 7) Flatten with fork or fingers
- 8) Bake for 25-30 mins until pale golden brown and come off tray easily
- 9) Cool on wire rack
- 10) SERVE SIX FOR SHOW
